Brief History

Swami Dhananjoy Das Kathiababa Mahavidyalaya since its inception in 2009 is committed to making higher studies accessible to the underprivileged sections of society and the rural population of adjacent villages. Located in the remote village of Bhara, roughly about 20 kilometres from the tourist town of Bishnupur, in the district of Bankura, the college is an outcome of the earnest endeavour of the local people. Named after the 56th Acharya of the Akhil Bharatiya Nimbarka religious sect the institute has a pan-Indian association. Disciples from both home and abroad have contributed to its infrastructural development and academic enrichment.

Classes were initially conducted in the adjacent High School and the first batch of students added to a total of 71 in 2009. In the following year in 2010, classes formally began at the college premises. Since then, the infrastructure of the college has evolved and there has been a simultaneous increase in student strength.



Affiliated Subjects:

The institution at present offers Honours degree in seven subjects (Bengali, English, Education, History, Geography, Sanskrit and Santali) alongside Programme Courses in eleven subjects (Bengali, English, Education, History, Geography, Sanskrit, Sociology, Political Science, Physical Education, Philosophy and Santali) and Generic in seven subjects (Bengali, English, Education, History, Geography, Sanskrit and Santali).

Extra-Curricular activities:

Apart from striving for academic recognition the college has acted as a platform to showcase the talents of the students in a wide range of extra-curricular activities including sports, debate, quiz, drawing, extempore and numerous other cultural activities, paving the way for a holistic growth of its student community. Apart from nurturing aspirations to excel academically the college strives to instil humanitarian and social values in its students through units like the NSS. Community welfare is an integral part of its education scheme and various camps are organised from time to time to engineer concrete changes in the adjacent neighbourhood through active service.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

Post publication of plus two results all successful candidates are eligible to apply for online registration for Honours and Programme Courses through the Online Admission Website: www.bharacollege.in Last H.S. academic year to be considered for admission 2017 as per Bankura University Guidelines. For admission in Honours Courses it is prerequisite to have 45 percent in aggregate on the basis of best five subject marks . In case of Geography and Sanskrit Honours the candidate must have these two subjects as part of their H.S. curriculum.

Merit list will be published on the Online Admission Website. Subject combination options will be available according to the rules and prescriptions of Bankura University. Vocational students may only enrol in Programme Courses in Humanities or Arts.

Reservation for PWD, ST, SC, OBC-A, OBC-B will be as per Bankura University & State Govt. norms.

Students are advised to follow the college website[www.sddkm.in] and the college notice board regularly, for up to date information regarding class schedule, university registration, form fill up, study leave, exam schedule, and list of holidays.

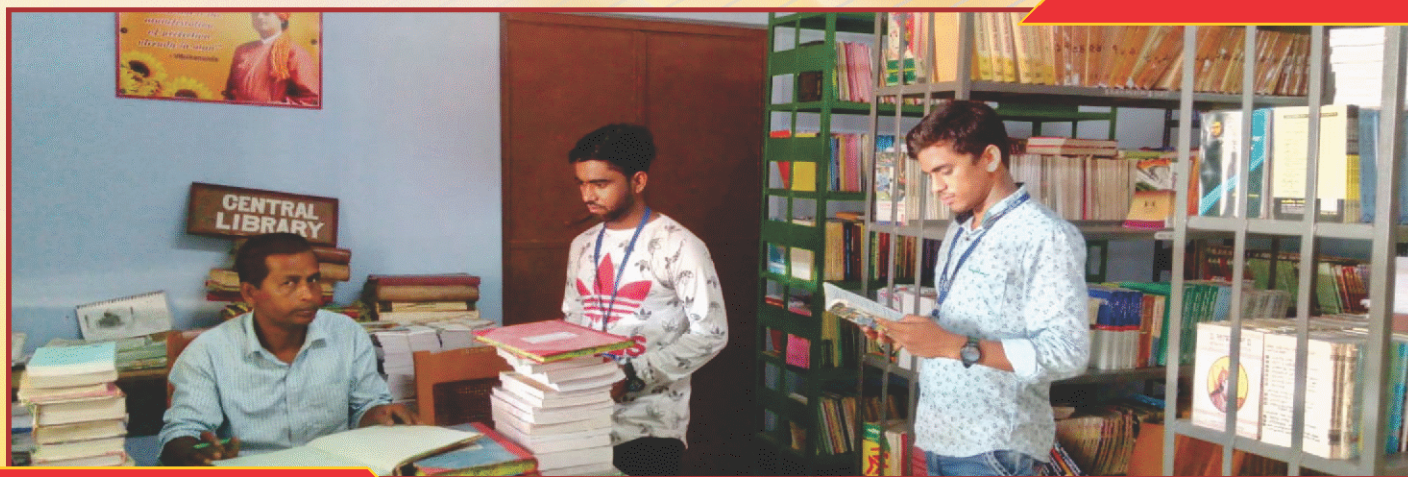
ACADEMIC RESOURCES

LIBRARY

The College is equipped with a spacious library with a sizeable collection of books and newspapers. Students avail of the resources in the library and spend time in the reading area for gathering information on various aspects of their study. The library apart from circulating academic material also houses magazines which provide information regarding various job vacancies. Apart from the Central library, Departmental library resources are also provided in case of some subjects. In future departmental libraries will provide more specialised literature and study material on subject specific topics.

Once admitted in First Year the student will be provided with a library card issued from the office. On producing this card the student will be permitted to borrow a maximum of three books from the library. The borrowed books can be kept for a maximum of fifteen days. Failure to return the books on time will entail a fine calculated on a daily basis. Prior to form fill up for every semester it is mandatory to return all books borrowed.

The college also provides internet access to students for accessing e-resources. At present the college has four desktops which can be accessed for reference work.



College Magazine

The college magazine entitled "Nabankur" is published annually encouraging students and staff members to submit their essays, art works and creative writings which then undergo a screening process through the magazine committee. Wall magazines are also displayed by various departments showcasing student art works and writings.

Anti-Ragging Cell

The college authorities strongly condemn ragging in any form and adheres to the Anti-Ragging Act 2000 of the Govt. of W.B. which was further strengthened by the Supreme Court order of May, 2007.

Grievance Cell

The grievance cell has been constituted to address various problems concerning the psychological health and interactive dynamics between teachers and students. Students can report their grievances anonymously through a drop box.

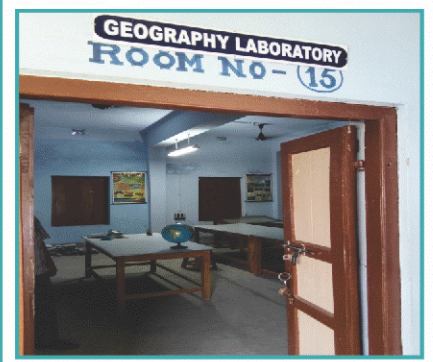
Cultural Activities

Our Students actively participate in various local and state-level cultural competitions such as drawing competitions, essay competitions, quiz competitions, extempore etc. Geography Hons student Sahidur Rahaman secured 1st position in the District Extempore Competition in 2017. LABORATORY

There are two lab-based subjects at present, Geography and Physical Education. The Geography Lab is well equipped with all the necessary instruments and also provides internet access to students. As stated earlier there are four desk top computers for use by students. The Physical Education Department is also well provided with various sporting gears and equipments, floor mats and miscellaneous sports goods.



MULTIGYM

There is a well equipped gymnasium with a manual treadmill and strength training equipments. On payment of a nominal fee of Rs.40/- per month students can avail of the gym facilities under a specialised instructor.



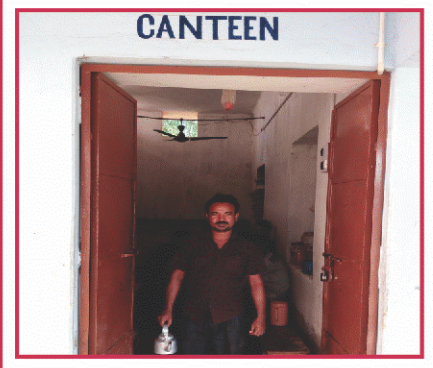
SPORTS

CANTEEN

The canteen room is located adjacent to the gymnasium. Work is underway to construct a more spacious canteen and add to the present menu. The canteen offers meals and snacks to students at a reasonable rate.





VIRTUAL CLASS ROOM

Recently the college has developed one large room into e-classroom (Virtual classroom) equipped with different types of modern teaching aids such as power point, smart-board, audio-visual system etc. to provide the students of the college with better teaching-learning atmosphere.



COMMON ROOM

The college provides separate common room facilities for girls and boys. Both rooms provide a recreational space where the students can refresh their minds by playing caroms, table tennis etc.



HOSTEL

There is a boy's hostel adjacent to the college premises. In order to avail of hostel facilities the male candidate can apply in the requisite format for consideration. The number of beds in the hostel is limited and the maximum capacity is forty. A yearly hostel fees of Rs 1400/- (Rupees One thousand four hundred only) covering admission charges, bed charges, cook and electricity expenses will have to be paid. The hostel has a mess where a cook and a helper provided by the college take care of daily meals.



NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The NSS Unit of the college recruits hundred students from each year and engages them in various social projects to raise community awareness. It thus instils an ideal of service in youthful minds. Various events such as Blood Donation Camp, Nirmal Bangla Avijan and Legal Awareness Camp, Village level Survey are organised to involve students in social welfare.

CAMPUS HIGHLIGHTS

- **The Department of English** offers a short term course in **Spoken English** on an annual basis. The Vice Chancellor and eminent faculty members from various adjoining colleges are invited to conduct classes. Internal faculty members also offer the necessary guidance and resources to assist students.



- **A Workshop on the CBCS curriculum** was organized by the college governing body on 20.09.2018. It was inaugurated by the Vice-Chancellor of Bankura University. The workshop was conducted to offer a synoptic overview of the syllabus structure for ease of comprehension of teachers as well as students.



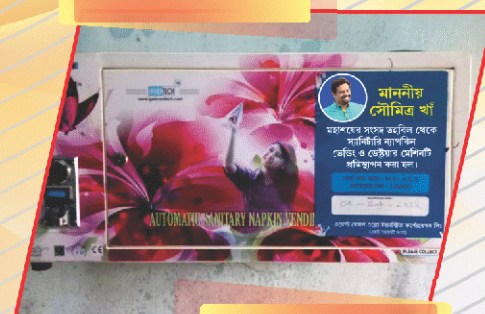

ACHIEVEMENTS

Session 2018 - 2019

The college welcomed its first Principal Dr Kakali Ghosh Sengupta in August 2018. Professor Sengupta took up office from erstwhile Teacher In Charge Dr Mahuya Bandyopadhyay. Under her able guidance and competent leadership the college looks forward to further growth and expansion of its academic ambit.

A parents- teacher meet was organised by Professor Sengupta with the assistance of faculty and staff at the college premises. The object of the meeting was to spread awareness regarding the recently introduced CBCS curriculum and ensure student participation in both academic and extracurricular events organised by the college. The meeting recorded a significant participation from the guardian and students who interacted with the Principal, faculty members and office staff discussing various pertinent issues.

The first meeting for the formation of College Alumni Association was held on 16.05.2019. The association was formed with the initiative for the all round infrastructural development of the college.

The formation of a Parents Teacher Association was proposed and with this end in view a meeting has been convened on the 17th of May, 2019.



A Poster Exhibition was organized by the Department of English with the theme "Heal the World". Students displayed their art works, recited poetry and sang songs to promote healthy community practices in tune with the environment. A well balanced gender ratio was also highlighted as an integral aspect of social development.

Bhasa Dibas was celebrated by the Department of Bengali on the 21st February.

A Students Seminar on environmental issues was conducted by the Geography Department along with a tree plantation campaign.

The college football team yet again put up a good performance and secured a runners-up position in the inter college event organised by Bankura University following up on last year's performance.

The IQAC cell operative since February 2019 in conjunction with various sub committees closely monitors academic and extracurricular activities to ensure steady progress in the fields of research, training and teaching methodologies.

- 75 percent attendance in the first fifteen days from the commencement of classes is mandatory. Otherwise admission will be cancelled.
- An annual attendance of 75 percent is prerequisite for form fill up prior to exams.
- Candidature will be cancelled if the candidate fails to meet registration and enrolment deadlines posted on the college website.
- No student will be allowed to enter the college premises without the college ID Card.
- All fees that are due will have to be cleared within the stipulated date.
- Meritorious students will be awarded the “Kathiababa Scholarship” on the basis of academic performance, attendance in class lectures and income certificate verified by the SDO/BDO.
- **All ST, SC, OBC-A, OBC-B students are eligible for Govt. grants and fellowships only if their attendance is above 75 percent.**
- If a student misbehaves or is guilty of unethical behaviour within the college premises legal action will be taken against him or her.
- Underprivileged and needy students who show a steady academic progress will receive aid from Student Aid Fund.
- Any kind of damage done to college property including library books, laboratory equipments, notice board and the college infrastructure in general will lead to severe punishment and suspension.
- Admission procedure for first semester will be conducted solely through online procedure, adhering to the admission rules and regulations as specified under the CBCS system of Bankura University.
- All information regarding admission rules and regulations, advertisement and merit list, publication date and time will be published on the college website and admission portal. (www.bharacollege.in)
- Please read the rules carefully before filling up the admission form. The candidate will be responsible for any error committed while filling up the form and his/her admission may be cancelled on account of wrong information provided with particular reference to H.S. result.
- While filling up the Registration form please carefully insert the registered mobile number and mail-id. All information regarding USER ID PASSWORD and MERIT LIST will be communicated via SMS.
- Candidates from a vocational background can only enrol for Programme Courses.
- At the time of Registration the candidate can opt for three Honours subjects of his/her choice. At the time of admission the candidate will be allowed to change his Honours if she or he so desires. This will be a one time opportunity. For a candidate who has registered for both the Honours & Programme Courses, if selected on merit basis in the Honours Course, She/he can switch from Programme to Honours.
- For further queries contact the college Helpline 03244-248586 from 11 am. to 4 pm.
- In case of Programme, the student can select two subjects of his/her choice-one from each discipline-Discipline 1 and Discipline 2. The subject opted for in Discipline 1 will be the primary subject and the degree will be awarded in the primary subject.
- Candidate pursuing Honours will have to opt for a Generic Elective (except Physical Education). The Generic Elective cannot be changed in the following semesters.
- While selecting **Programme** subjects kindly adhere to the following subject bar Group-A or Group B.
- Every candidate under Hons. & Programme course has to choose ENVS as compulsory subject.

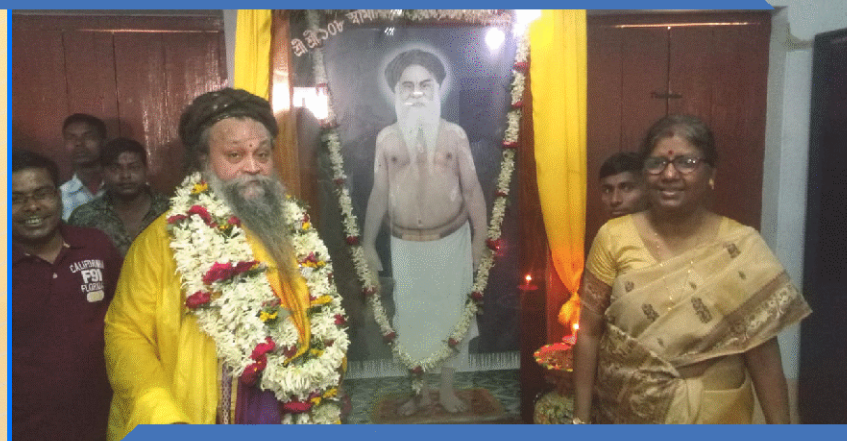
